A Pilgrim People

The BBC 'Pilgrimage', followed a group of celebrities on a journey of a lifetime. With different faiths and beliefs, the challenge was to see how stepping in ancient footsteps on a spiritual journey in North Wales would broaden their minds, hearts,

inspire and re-awaken a hunger for the divine.

They walked the 220km Pilgrim's Way, with the route beginning near St Winefride's Well and ending at Ynys Enlli (Bardsey Island), on the tip of Llyn Peninsula. Fabled as the 'Island of 20,000 saints', Ynys Enlli was a popular destination for early Celtic Christian monks, who believed it to be the end of the world.

It was fascinating to observe the interaction of the pilgrims, the vulnerabilities and wounds which bubbled to the surface for healing and restoration to begin. There was a moment in the programme when the pilgrims were introduced and invited to be still in a 'thin place'. For the Celtic saints, who were deeply connected to the natural world, this is where heaven touches earth. It is an undeniable connection to the sacred.



Bethel, Mount Sinai, the Tabernacle and Tent of Meeting were thin places in scripture. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre, St Antony's Cave, St Peter's in Rome, Canterbury Cathedral, Santiago de Compostela, Lourdes, and other famous pilgrimage sites are examples from Christian history.

Iona in Scotland or Lindisfarne (Holy Island) in Northumberland are known to be such places, but there are many

ancient places, hidden and waiting to be discovered. Places where the air is still 'thin' and God can be easily found. These places where Christians worshipped and prayed, in previous centuries, are often known as 'spiritual portals' or 'wells'.

There are 'thin places' where I have found prayer effortless and encountered the

Lord in ways that have been profound and even life changing: St David's, Ty Mawr Convent, 'Ffald Y Brenin' and Llannerchwen retreat centre.

We all need to nurture our spiritual lives and I encourage you to consider visiting some of these wonderful 'thin places' especially as summer approaches, and hopefully the weather improves! Perhaps even consider going on a personal 'retreat'. Lee Abbey, which lies on the North Devon Coast, is a wonderful Christian retreat, holiday and conference centre. The website (https://leeabbeydevon.org.uk/) will give you a flavour of the centre and the range of retreats offered during the year.

Are we not pilgrim people?

The celebrity pilgrims are not unique, for we are all on a journey of a lifetime. With the closure of the church we are most definitely moving from the old to the new. In all the upheaval of the refurbishment, and the demands of worshipping in a different setting it is important to find the time to be still renewed and strengthened as God's people. What will help you grow in faith and how will you create space for the Lord to speak and you to listen?





As you are aware, following our visit to the Diocese of the Highveld in November 2023, Bishop Cherry has chosen our link diocese as her Lent Appeal recipient this year. The problems we saw whilst there are not dissimilar to some of the ones we see here but the number of people experiencing lack of work, lack of food and of basic sanitary items, to mention just a few, is colossal, and when we say they have nothing, that is exactly what we mean!

Chris and I, with essential help from Chris Edwards, who is writing it, and also the amazing members of the Action Committee, held a Murder Mystery event on Friday 26th April in aid of the Lent Appeal. The evening was very successful and raised £965, which will be added to money we raised previously from the Christmas Greeting Tree, personal donations and the Christmas Tree Festival Raffle and be sent as St Cadoc's contribution to the appeal. Thank you to everyone who has contributed in any way to the funds we have raised.

One of the essentials that is constantly required in the Highveld and which we delivered to a school when we made our visit last November was that of sanitary items. In February, Julio and I made a visit to Raven House Trust with a visiting ordinand from our link diocese. During this visit, we learnt that there was a supply of sanitary items available but the cost to transport it to the Highveld made it unviable to get them where they were desperately needed.

However, God moves in a mysterious way and, following a conversation with Bruce Johnson and an email from him to a contact he has in Johannesburg, four large boxes of sanitary items have set off in a container on their journey to St Dunstan's Cathedral, Benoni, and the office of the Highveld Anglican Board of Social Responsibility (HABSR). The Safe Parks, which ensured some security for children at the end of the school day have, for the most part, not reopened following covid, due to a lack of money to train helpers and to provide resources and meals to run them. This has resulted in greater social problems, with girls being abused, as there are no responsible adults to protect them when they get home from school. There has also been an increase in young people resorting to crime to gain some money to help their families.

Our parish of All Souls is playing its part in helping those in need. Three times a week they feed the 60 or more people who gather at the gate of the church. The parishioners have reinstated a tithe to Buyani House, their outreach centre, to enable them to reach out to people in need. They quote that 9,333 meals were served in 2023. Buyani House has joined a project which offers training courses for the unemployed and is setting aside money for this purpose. Monthly parcels of non-perishable food are sent out to 45 families with children at Katlehong School and at the

end of 2023 they contributed cakes and gifts to the Christmas party for the children.

Don King, one of their parishioners who we have met on several visits, continues to develop food gardens to help youngsters to learn a trade and to provide food for the community. Fran and the parishioners of All Souls send their very best wishes to all at St Cadoc's.

REFLECTIONS OF AN OLD GEEZER ABOUT GOD AND HOW WE RELATE TO HIM

8. Learning to Forgive

Isn't God's forgiveness wonderful? Saying "sorry" wipes the slate clean and I'm free to start all over again. Or am I?

As a child I was taught that acknowledging my sins and asking for God's forgiveness was all that was necessary, because God is so merciful. Of course, like all good children, I always did as I was told and said sorry. Growing up, I started thinking for myself and naturally began to question. In my rebelliousness, questioning authority was more about justifying my own chosen view of the world. Inevitably, my personal justifications brought their own challenges, especially when I was drawn to read the Gospel.

"Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus immediately clarified what this means and left no wriggle room for interpretation.

"If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions."

Matt 6:14-15

Why does God not simply accept my apology at face value? Why does he make it so difficult? Jesus is saying that if I want total forgiveness, I must forgive totally. That's a big ask! Forgiveness is not easy when we have been hurt, especially when there is obviously no sincere repentance.

Forgiveness is clearly a big deal for Jesus. He has a lot to say about it throughout the Gospel. He also demonstrated God's standard of forgiveness on numerous occasions. He practiced what he preached, in no uncertain terms, not least by his sacrifice for us, on the cross.

"If your brother...repents, forgive him. And if he wrongs you seven times in one day and returns to you seven times saying, 'I am sorry,' you should forgive him."

Luke 17:3-4

It is hard to not bear a grudge when those who have offended will not own the hurt they have caused me, even when failing to forgive does more harm to me than the person I resent. I lie awake at night churning the hurt over and over in my head. In my worst moments I dream of ways to make them pay, but it does not help. It just destroys

my mental health. On the Alpha course they make the point that bearing a grudge is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die. How true!

My response to this tough teaching is much the same as Jesus' apostles: "And the apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.'"

Luke 17:5

After Jesus rose again and appeared to his apostles, he granted their request: "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain, are retained."

John 20:22-23

I had to think about what he meant by "whose sins you retain, are retained." Despite the gift of the Holy Spirit helping us to forgive unconditionally, we still have our free will. If we refuse to forgive, we retain not just our grudges, but also our sinfulness.

Unless we forgive, God cannot allow us to become one with him. Forgiveness is directly linked to judgment - our judgment of others and indeed, our own final judgment. If the Gospel is true, our Father's approach to judgment will be no different to Jesus. God will not decide my fate for all eternity. I will. It is up to me to accept God's offer to be one with him for all eternity, or not.

While God loves me unconditionally, oneness with him is conditional upon me being willing to align all I am and all I do, completely with him. I must forgive totally and unconditionally, just as he does. If I am not willing to embrace his Way, his Truth and his Life, I will be at odds with him and, as Jesus made abundantly clear, a house divided cannot stand. God obviously cannot allow that.

Being willing to stop doing things my way and return like the prodigal son, ready to unconditionally accept God's way, means God will come running out to welcome me with a ring and a splendid new coat. However, he will also come running out to welcome all those I have not forgiven, as well as those I may believe are not worthy to be embraced by him. If I choose to allow his behaviour to offend my self-righteousness, like the faithful son, I too will refuse to attend his banquet, no matter how much he begs me to join him.

I still have a long way go in learning to forgive, so I can become love, to become one with God. Fortunately, all is not lost. The Holy Spirit reminds me every day to pray: "Just for today, Lord, just for today!"
