Sunday 22nd June 2025 - PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

Peter and Paul, Apostles. Matthew 16:19, 'I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven.'

These were the words spoken to St Peter after he confessed at Caesarea Philippi that Jesus was the Christ the Son of the Living God. I have been reminded of the giving of those keys while on holiday in two places in Europe, which I recommend to you if



you haven't visited them already. Both reminders came in Latin which was the language of worship for so many Christians in Europe for more than a thousand years. Inside the dome of St Peter's cathedral in Rome you will find the verse at the beginning of this reflection in Latin: Tibi dabo claves regni coelorum, I will give to you the keys (claves) of the kingdom of heaven. This text became the basis of the claims of papal government and authority. The second reminder of this text is in the city of Barcelona, where there is a hill called 'Tibi dabo' hill, but this has nothing to do with Peter's promise of the keys to lock and unlock entry into the kingdom of heaven. Tibi Dabo hill reminds us of the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness, when Satan said to him: 'I will give to you, 'tibi dabo', all the kingdoms of the world and their glory if you will worship me.' That is what happens if we forget that God's kingdom is not worldly.

Peter and Paul share this feast day today, June 29th. They were very different people who did not always agree, as we learn from the New Testament. Paul accused Peter of eating with Gentiles but withdrawing from them when James came because Peter was afraid of Jewish influence. Peter did baptise Gentiles in the house of Cornelius, a Roman centurion, when he realised that the Gentiles had also received the Holy Spirit. It was only Jesus at work in Peter through the Holy











Spirit that enabled him to be the rock, which was the name that Jesus gave him.

In spite of their apparent differences, St Paul's message was essentially the same. He said that he was the least of the apostles because he persecuted God's Church, 'but by the grace of God, I am what I am' (I Corinthians, 15:10). When Paul, like Peter, was conscious of his own shortcomings, he heard the voice of Jesus saying to him: 'My grace is sufficient for you because power is made perfect in weakness. So I will boast all the more gladly of my weakness, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me' (2 Corinthians 12:9). Those are words that all Christians need to learn whether lay people or ordained deacons, priests or bishops, however long we have been baptised or ordained or if we are being ordained this week-end.

The Church is built upon the rock of Peter's faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. It is built upon the faith of the Apostles, Jesus Christ himself being the corner stone. (Ephesians 2:20). Jesus himself is the key to the kingdom, just as he was the key that unlocked the doors of their prisons for Peter and Paul. Jesus has entrusted the keys of his kingdom to frail earthen vessels like ourselves. We are called to be 'living stones' in his temple, as Peter reminded us, and to use our various gifts in his service, as Paul urged us. If God calls us to do something for him, he will give us the strength to do it.

READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread. When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, and was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' Peter went out and followed him; he did not realise that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.'
