God's Truth

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

John 3:16-17

For those who missed it, the Cambridge dictionary recently added some of new words, one of which is "delulu", derived from delusional, and defined as "believing things that are not real or true, usually because you choose to".

In our post-truth society, misinformation often supported by AI, is created as click currency to generate income on social media. The more outlandish the story, the more clicks it generates. Many people willingly choose to ignore all rational evidence to the contrary and believe complete nonsense. Social media also enables misinformation to be spewed out daily by people we should be able to trust, the most powerful leaders in the world. Choosing to believe fiction is nothing new.

In our earliest stories, going back all the way to Cain and Abel, humanity has tried to define God in our own image and likeness. We readily attribute human behaviour to God, that is totally inconsistent with his divine nature of perfect love, and we choose to believe it.

Some of us blame God, when we refuse to accept responsibility for our own failures and inability to control the world around us. Who better to blame than the Almighty God who has power over all. "How can a God of love allow bad things to happen to good people?"

Some choose to believe that God is no more than a petty king, requiring constant appearsement in case he gets angry with us for no good reason. Some believe that even if someone has never heard the name of Jesus and has never had the option to believe in him, they will be condemned to hell for all eternity. Why in heaven would a God without limits, a God with unlimited love, do a thing like that? When we choose love, we choose Jesus' way, truth and life, even if we have not heard of Jesus.











www.stcadocscaerleon.uk tel: 01633 421485 www.bma.church Others choose to believe in pre-destination, suggesting that God's grace is so limited that only a chosen few are pre-destined for heaven, while the rest of us are going to hell. If you're chosen, you're in, no matter what you do. Otherwise, you're out. If this is true, then hope is irrelevant. Make the most of every opportunity you have for self-gratification. Eat drink and be merry! Grab what you can before someone else does! It is this kind of delulu that caused God to take the extreme step of sending his own Son to remind us of the way, the truth and the life we can experience, when we choose to live under God's reign of love.

To know the true nature of God, we need look no further than Jesus: "If you know me, then you will also know my father." (Jn14:7). If we believe that truth must be consistent, then God consistently behaves as Jesus behaves. By his life, death and resurrection, Jesus was the incarnation of God's love: unconditional self-giving for the good of all. Truth needs to be consistent. If God is love, then it makes sense that God creates for no other reason than his desire to share all that he is with his creation. We are created for oneness with God.

Oneness means sharing in the fullness of God and his joy, which means surrendering totally to his nature of love. If we choose not to embrace his way, truth and life, then we cannot expect to be one with him. "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand." Mk 3:24-25

Because God's love is unconditional, he will not force us to accept his gift of oneness. This is confirmed by Lucifer's choice to go his own way when he decided that he wanted to be a god in his own right. God gives us a free will to choose our own path. If God is consistently true to his nature of love, he insists that our choice should not just be free, but also fully informed. It therefore makes sense that God should place us on Earth where we can experience both love and the absence of love. Here we experience both good and bad, because everything in God's creation is interconnected. Our self-centred behaviour affects and harms the innocent, just as the selfish, controlling behaviour of others impacts us, through no fault of our own. Similarly, no one can do love alone. It always has a positive impact on those around us. Earth also humbles us to learn that we are not gods and there are limits to our power over God's creation. In the parable of the prodigal son Jesus again confirms that God is not out to condemn us.

Like the prodigal son, when we humbly choose to live under God's roof on his terms, whatever those terms may be, we will discover just how generous God is, as he welcomes us with a cloak on our back, a ring on our finger and a feast to celebrate. When we make demands of God and self-righteously insist that because we have worked hard to earn his favour while others are unfairly welcomed into his embrace, we

will discover that while God always loves us unconditionally, oneness with him means that to love God, we must be willing to love all his creation unconditionally.

If we refuse to surrender to God's way of unconditional love, it is us rejecting God and refusing to join in his banquet, rather than God rejecting us. Any delulu we might choose to believe is not going to change that.


